Might you learn to see these "uncommon" things you do as a follower of Christ as part of your becoming more "holy?" How might you strive to become more holy this week?
- 4. For what "sacred purpose" have you been "set apart"? What has the Lord given you to do as a personal ministry on this earth?
- 5. How might you "defend your inner space" and bring greater peace, love, hope, and holiness inside you this week? How might you bring Christ more fully into your inner space, to create more sacred space, today?
